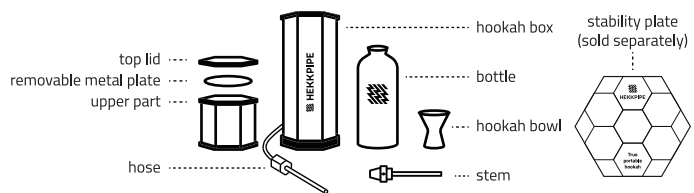
No foil needed

Ultra portable

Tilt up to 45 degrees

Smoke it anywhere

## For the best experience prep your Hexagon the right way



### 1. Take the hookah apart

The upper part is held in place by magnets so use a twisting motion.

### Pro tips

- You can **add ice** to the bottle to get tasty and cool smoke.
- Alternatively, keep the bottle with the stem filled with water **in the freezer for 30 mins.**
- When the water comes to the hose, **lift the hookah up and pour the water away from the hose.**
- If you **don't hear the bubbling sound** when smoking, **add some water.**

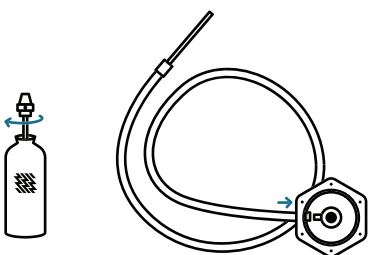


### 2. Fill the bottle **almost half full of cold water**

250 ml or 8.5 oz is just perfect.

How much is enough? Attach the stem to the bottle, tilt the bottle horizontally and let the extra water run out.

Or, suck from the hose hole and see if there is any extra water that needs to be poured out.



### 3. Screw on the stem and attach the hose

Guide the hose through the hole in the wooden box onto the hose part of the hookah stem.

You may have to use some force to attach the hose to keep the hose tightened during the session.



### 4. Use the **needle** to pull pieces of tobacco into the **bowl**

This way you keep the pincers clean of tobacco to easily light the coal.

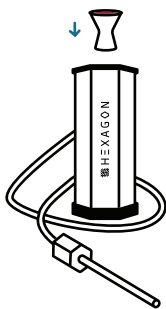
If you have an additional bowl, prepare this one, too. This is how you enjoy a non-stop hookah session.

### Tobacco pro tips

- **Shred the chunks of tobacco** into small pieces so heat can strike the tobacco more evenly.
- **Don't pack the bowl above the holes** on the center vortex to leave a space between the foil and the tobacco. This also keeps the holes clean of burnt tobacco.
- Use **only fresh and wet tobacco** as dried tobacco will burn your throat.

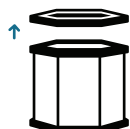

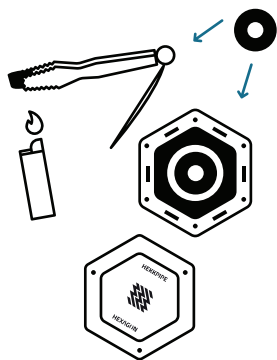
## 5. Place the grommet and **hookah bowl** on the **stem**

But don't attach the upper part just yet.



## 6. Remove the **lid** from the **upper part**

You can now access the metal compartment which will hold the coals.



## 7. **Light the coal** and place it in the **metal compartment**

When using quick-lighting charcoal, hold the coal with pincers while igniting it.

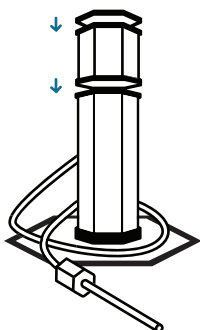
Natural coal needs a lot more exposure to heat to get it red hot. A stove, torch or a fireplace will do the trick.

### Coal pro tips

- **Don't light up the coal while the metal compartment is on the hookah bowl!** so you don't ruin your batch of tobacco.
- **Get the coal red hot before placing the upper part.** For this, **blow on the coal in the compartment and shake them** - this will also heat up the metal plate and you get thick smoke sooner.
- **Start the session without the metal plate**, but add it after that for a longer session.
- **Don't split the coal.**  
A 25 mm<sup>3</sup> natural coal or a 44 mm coal ring fits perfectly. If you use a smaller coal, don't use the metal plate.

### Pro tips for the perfect session

- **Regulate the heat.** If you use a smaller coal than suggested above, add an extra piece.
- **Always smoke with the lid attached** so the hot coal is safely kept in place.
- If the smoke gets harsh, **carefully blow into the hose to ventilate.** You can also do this to get fresh smoke. If you blow too hard, you might push water into the bowl and ruin your session.
- To move the coal around on the bowl, just **tilt your Hekkpipes.** It's a good idea to **repeat this every 5 minutes** so that the tobacco heats evenly.
- **Remove the upper part to check on your tobacco.** You can order a second hookah bowl to prepare the next batch of tobacco and keep your session going with the same coal.
- **Be careful when using the metal plate.** First, it gets really hot. Second, don't throw it away!
- To add stability to your Hexagon, **use the stability plate** (sold separately).



## 8. Place the **lid** and the **upper part**

You're all done! Good job
